
- **C6** (#4, ♘e1-♘e4, 6+12) – duals 1...♘d3 ... 3.b:a8(♗) and 4.♗a(♗):d5;

- **C25** (#13, ♘h5-♘a3, 11+10) – duals 2...♗g6 3.f8(♕) ♘:f8 and also 3...♗f8 4.a8(♕) ♘g6 5.♕f8 ♘b2 6.a7(♕) f5(f6,f7).



You can't immediately play with the tempo 1. $\mathbb{B}a8$, since there is no mating threat to the black king with the white bishop from the e4 square. Therefore, you need to prepare for such an opportunity by moving the bishop to a more advantageous position:
